CANDIDATE STATEMENTS (in alphabetical order)

Graeme Banks - I have lived in Steep for over thirty years and worked at Bedales School throughout that time. For the last eighteen years I have been Head of English and last year took on a new senior management role as Head of Outreach. In this capacity I am, among other things, responsible for Bedales local community service. My four children were all educated at the Jubilee Nursery and Steep Primary School and they, together with my wife, who teaches at Dunhurst, have been involved with village life in many ways.
