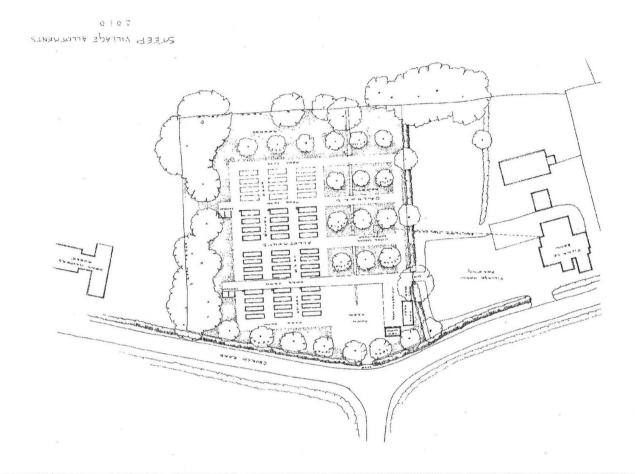
## Steep Allotment Society

### Vision

- ☐ A village green space, orchard, wild meadow and play area for all, and allotments for those who want to grow
- □ a place in which the community can get together; the education of children; maintaining traditional skills; providing land and amenities for food production and environmental sustainability

# Key Planning & Site clearance: June – July 2010

- ☐ High level plans presented to Steep Trustees and other interested groups
- Project plan creation: financing details and lock down, timings and schedules required to hit Autumn season
- ☐ Memberships and Public Liability Insurance required: NSALG (£220, approx £300 respectively, paid for by SAS account)
- ☐ Mowing of the land followed by grazing of local sheep from Bedales School
- □ Weed clearance and cultivation site to be cultivated or ploughed if necessary creation of level site
- Responsibility of: local farmers and land owners have been approached for assistance with this

- This will cover any costs of raw materials and labour that we are not able to cover through the generosity of our local schools and organisations and from village benefactors.
- Clearing out and establishment of the main drainage ditch to west of site
- Digging out of 2-4 additional drainage ditches:

matching (details can be provided once finalised)

Responsibility of: to be confirmed. Digging machinery provided FOC from local tool hire П company. Part assistance from Bedales Outdoor Facilities particularly with respect to drainage of ditches towards pond

#### Provision of water:

- Digging of underground rainwater harvesting tank (Graf Rondus rainwater storage tank 3000 litres for shallow ground system - £1080 from SAS account)
- Piping from Village Memorial Hall roof gutterings
- Siting of troughs on hard standing areas on north side of site
- Back up mains water provision in case of 2-4 week drought to be discussed

Laying down of hard standing surfaces and bases for tool shed and amenity hut

- Preparation for gated entrance from village hall
- Management of current boundaries (hedge cutting / weed removal / tree pruning)
- Responsibility of: 2 local land owners have offered assistance with this area

# Materials sourcing & Wild Meadow Planting

- Wood or other recycled material to be used for beds and filled with recycled Veola compost at a cost of £50 per bed max (24 to be completed = £1200)
- □ Hardwood for amenity hut and tool shed, concrete for hard standing, sourced though local contact at wholesale rate £1350
- ☐ £2550 payable from Steep Allotment Society account
- ☐ Fixing of gated entrance from Church Road to allow for vehicular access
- $\Box$  1 x pedestrian gate, posts and entrance, fitted £350
- $\Box$  1 x vehicular gate, posts and entrance, fitted £750
- □ Quote from local fencing company £1100 payable from SAS account
- □ Wild Meadow Area to Southern most Northern most sections of the site (in parallel with Church Road
- □ Sow Wild Meadow (6 kilos per acre) Sept 10.
- ☐ Areas to be raked and tilled following cultivation, then sown by hand
- □ Seeds paid from SAS account approx £650 but discount available if bought via NSALG membership
- □ £650 from SAS Account

## Planning of site creation: Aug 10

- Orchard plans (in conjunction with Anna Baldwin and Carol Glover) £15 per tree including animal protection and planting mixture. 36 trees planned for ata cost to SAS of £540 from account
- designs and finalisation of specs of raised beds
- □ fencing of allotment boundaries mapped out
- □ Details for All In Work Weekend: working groups / worksheets, delivery plans, tools, manpower, resources required, scheduling

## Site Creation: October 2010 – Bedales All In Weekend

- ☐ 425 students, in addition to teachers, Friends of Steep Allotment Society and Villagers working on a weekend project to:
- □ Make & fill raised beds
- □ Turf pathways between beds
- □ Erection of deer fencing surrounding allotment plots (hard materials cost £750 1000 from SAS account
- □ Construction of hardwood framed amenity hut and tool shed
- □ Planting of fruit trees / orchard where appropriate (or preparation of site for future planting

## Final completion - Oct 2010

- ☐ Tool shed lockers (provided FOC by local Tool company)
- □ Benches and picnic tables to be sited (donations from Friends of Steep Allotments Society)
- □ Opening party / entertainments: jointly held with Bedales School and village residents

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## Funding

- □ £7940 required at this time from SAS funds
- □ £1500 contingency fund
- □ Aiming to raise £15000 in total. Account currently stands at £900.00
- □ Please note that at this time the SAS is not applying to the Trustees for any funding of this community project
